

WHO MAY BENEFIT

An evaluation at the Baptist Memory Disorder Clinic may be beneficial if you or a loved one exhibit one or more of the following behaviors:

- Difficulty performing everyday tasks
- Loss of initiative
- Memory loss
- Repeating statements or questions
- Poor judgment or concentration
- Misplacing things in unusual places
- Difficulty with speech, reading, writing or communication
- Personality, mood or behavior changes
- Disorientation to time or place
- Problems with abstract thinking

SERVICES

The Baptist Memory Disorder Clinic provides comprehensive neurological evaluations and reviews the medical history for patients concerned about memory loss, including Alzheimer's disease, Vascular, Parkinson's disease, head trauma and other neurological causes. Also, since not all memory loss is permanent, the Memory Disorder team is trained to evaluate for reversible causes of memory loss.

The Clinic offers state-certified training programs and educational materials to help caregivers and medical professionals care for persons with Alzheimer's disease and related memory disorder. We offer assistance to families in accessing a variety of safety concerns and connect you with resources in our community, such as respite care, support groups, and home care services.

EVALUATION

The Baptist Memory Disorder Clinic offers an outpatient evaluation that includes: A thorough neurological evaluation and review of medical documentation by a Neurologist; Psychosocial assessment by a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, Neuropsychological testing by a Neuropsychologist, and an evaluation summary conference with the patient and caregiver, including a review of the diagnosis, referrals and recommendations.

APPOINTMENTS

COST AND BILLING

Most insurance carriers, including Medicare and Medicaid, cover memory disorder evaluations. Many insurance plans require patients or families to obtain authorization for evaluations.
